I, Dan H. Stone, — Prothonotary of
the Court of Common Pleas, in and for said County, do by
these presents certify, that on the fifth day of
March in the year A. D. 1888, personally
came before me John Jacob Koehnele
a native of Germany — and heretofore a
subject of the Emperor of Germany —

And having been duly sworn, according to law, made his declaration, stating that it
was bona fide his intention to become a Citizen of the United States, and renouncing and
abjuring all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereign-
ty whatever, and particularly renouncing and abjuring all allegiance and fidelity to
the Emperor of Germany —
whereof he was a former subject.

the said Court, at Beaver, this fifth day of March — in the year
A. D. 1888, and of the Independence of the United States the 112.
