Humbly Sheweth, That your petitioner is a

native of Germany and was heretofore a subject of the

Emperor of Germany

that he has resided within the limits and under the jurisdiction of the United States of America ¹⁶ ~~five~~ years, and within the State of Pennsylvania one year; and that he ~~was two~~ ^{enlisted} in the volunteer force in the army of the United States and has been honorably discharged and ~~years~~ prior to this application declared his intention of becoming a citizen of the United States in a manner required by law, as in and by the certificate herunto attached ~~discharged~~ ^{years}; that he will support the Constitution of the United States, and that he doth absolutely and entirely renounce and forever abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate and sovereignty whatever, and particularly to the said Emperor of Germany whereof he was heretofore a subject. Your petitioner therefore prays that he may be admitted to become a citizen of the United States of America.

I, John Husch do swear that the facts set forth in this my petition are true and that I will support the Constitution of the United States; and that I do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure forever, all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate or sovereignty whatever, and particularly do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure forever, all allegiance and fidelity to the Emperor of Germany of which I was heretofore a subject.
