And having duly been sworn according to law, made his declaration, stating that it
was bona fide his intention to become a Citizen of the United States. and renouncing
and abjuring all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State or
Sovereignty whatever, and particularly renouncing and abjuring all allegiance and
fidelity to the Queen of Great Britain and Ireland and Empress
of India whereof he was a former subject.
