COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

HAMPDEN, SS.

BE IT REMEMBERED, That at the Superior Court, at Springfield, within and for the County of Hampden, on the twenty-fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-ninety.

Personally appeared James Muldoon of Springfield said Commonwealth, an Alien, and by his Declaration in writing, on oath, set forth, That he was born at

Blackshaw, Renfrewshire, in Scotland

on or about the sixth day of May, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty, and is now about thirty years of age; that he arrived at

New York, fourth

in the United States of America, on or about the day of May, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and eighty-two; that it then was, and still is his bona fide intention to become citizen of the United States of America, and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, State, Potentate, and Sovereignty whatsoever, more especially to Victoria, Queen of Great Britain and Ireland and Empress of India,

whose subject he has heretofore been. He therefore prayed that his said Declaration and Intention might become a record of said court, agreeably to the laws in such case made and provided. Whereupon the Declaration of the said James Muldoon, is admitted to become a record of said Court, accordingly.
