


BEAVER COUNTY, SS:

I, David N. Stone Prothonotary of the Court of Common Pleas, in and for said County, do by these presents certify, that on the 26th day of

May in the year A. D. 1891, personally came before me Wilmar Julius Siegel

a native of Norway and heretofore a subject of the King of Norway and Sweden

And having been duly sworn, according to law, made his declaration, stating that it was bona fide his intention to become a Citizen of the United States, and renouncing and abjuring all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and particularly renouncing and abjuring all allegiance and fidelity to the King of Norway and Sweden whereof he was a former subject.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the seal of the said Court, at Beaver, this 26th day of May in the year A. D. 1891, and of the Independence of the United States the 15th.

I, Wilmar Julius Siegel, do swear that the facts set forth in this, my petition, are true, and that I will support the Constitution of the United States; and that I do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure forever, all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate or sovereignty whatever, and particularly do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure forever, all allegiance and fidelity to the Queen of Great Britain and Ireland and Empress of India, King of Norway + Sweden, of which I was heretofore a subject.
