

To the Honorable JOHN BREDIN, President, and THOMAS HENRY and BENJAMIN ADAMS, Esqs. Associate Judges of the Court of Common Pleas, now sitting for Beaver County:

The Petition of *Fredrick Wolf* of the County of Beaver, humbly sheweth: THAT your Petitioner, *has Resided within the United States for the last 5 years*

within the State of Pennsylvania, at least three years, that he will support the Constitution of the United States, and that he doth absolutely renounce and abjure, all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, State or sovereignty whatever, particularly to the *King of Prussia* to whom he was heretofore a subject, that he hath never borne any hereditary title, nor hath been of any of the orders of nobility in the Kingdom from which he came, and is ready to declare on oath the truth of these things, and prays to be admitted a Citizen of the United States, and of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
