


BEAVER COUNTY, SS:

I, George W. MacLach Prothonotary of
the Court of Common Pleas, in and for said County, do by these
presents certify that on the 20 day of

Sept. in the year A. D. 1877, personally
came before me Charles Castrique
a native of England and heretofore a
subject of the Queen of Great Britain & Ireland
and Empress of India

And having been duly sworn, according to law, made his declaration, stating that it was
bona fide his intention to become a Citizen of the United States, and renouncing and ad-
juring all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty
whateyer, and particularly renouncing and adjuring all allegiance and fidelity to
the Queen of Great Britain & Ireland and Empress of India,
whereof he was a former subject.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the seal of
the said Court, at Beaver, this 20th day of Sept. in the
year A. D 1877, and of the Independence of the United States the 122.
