The petition of *Robert Gibson* of the County of Beaver,
humbly sheweth, That your Petitioner, *was about twenty years old*
when he arrived in the United States and has resided
therein since 1801 — *and* within the State of Pennsylvania, at
least three years, that he will support the Constitution of the United States, and that
he doth absolutely renounce, and abjure, all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign
prince, potentate, state or sovereignty whatever, particularly to the *King of*
England — to whom he was
heretofore a subject, that he never hath borne any hereditary title, nor hath been of
any of the orders of nobility in the Kingdom from which he came, and is ready to
declare on oath, the truth of these things, and prays to be admitted, a Citizen of the
United States, and of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
